LGBTIQ+ ELDERS DANCE CLUB

'The Elders Dance Club events were received wonderfully well by all who attended, particularly after emerging from covid lockdowns. Older LGBTIQA+ people are some our most vulnerable community members. Already experiencing isolation and a disconnect from friends and loved ones, Dance Club provided a much-needed energy boost and a chance to meet new people, reconnect with friends and to access information from Meridian around how to link in with services and supports thanks to our Aged Care Coordinators, Kyla Harvey and Sharon Alles. Physical activity is also an important part of Dance Club and while participants are encouraged to participate at their own pace, many simply watched and thoroughly enjoyed themselves. We saw participants challenge themselves and move out of their comfort zone through simple dance steps to great music, led by warm and welcoming dance instructors. The simple act of participation brought joy and laughter to all participants. 'Partnering with A+G has been instrumental in achieving outcomes to actions within the Australian Government, Department of Health- Actions to Support Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Trans and Gender Diverse and Intersex elders, and in building connections to vulnerable LGBTI+ folk. The elder's dance has improved social connections with community members and strengthened partnerships and collaborations with other inclusive services, such as the Lesbian dance club and Queer Zumba.

According to the National LGBTIQ+ Health Australia, LGBTI+ individuals in Australia are twice as likely to be diagnosed and treated for mental health disorders compared to the general population. The Elders dance supports living well within our community, such as combating social isolation, providing intergenerational opportunities, reducing cultural safety risks for LGBTI elders and older Allies from other vulnerable sub-groups, such as culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities.

LIVE ART LAB

'A+G was where the collaborative relationship started, and A+G has been providing producer support for this project (among many other projects of mine). The collaborative relationship of Cathy, Zhi and I came from the Live Art Lab 2021 where we were able to come together and share our practice with the group. Before that I didn't know Cathy. I think it is valuable to show the whole picture that A+G has supported the development of my practice hugely, and the seed of this project was planted in this process. The mentorship and producer advice and the creative conversations we have had, are the kinds of support emerging art professionals like myself need. For example, just for this Eros project, the A+G producers had three meetings and many emails with me to discuss the idea and provide feedback for the application. It is also valuable to capture the outcomes of the support A+G has offered, which can often slip through the busy schedule. I also sincerely want to say that it is actually very unique of A+G to provide so much support for artists who are having less opportunities or early in their career. 'My name is Vaidehi Subramanyan and I am a Canberra-based Bharatanatyam (South Indian classical) dancer. While I dedicatedly practise my art form, I had very little experience seeking opportunities to perform and putting together productions (and all the administration that goes along with that!) before reaching out to Ainslie + Gorman Arts Centre. As I do not come from a dance school in Canberra, I am a solo artist with only few contacts in the arts community. A+G were incredibly warm, friendly and supportive during my initial conversations with them, and quickly developed an understanding of my dance practice. Accordingly, they provided insights and ideas to me as to how I can transform my artistic practice into a profession, and offered administrative and financial support for me when possible and particularly helpful for me to realise those ideas.
