








Percentage of respondents who visited arts and cultural locations in the last 12 months (Dynata Community Sample, n = 156).






Percentage of respondents who visited arts and cultural locations in the last 12 months (Arts Capital Sample, n = 135).






Have you visited Ainslie Arts Centre in the last 12 months and with whom? (n = 224)






Have you visited Gorman Arts Centre / Gorman House in the last 12 months and with whom? (n = 224)






Please indicate how often you typically attend the following arts and cultural activities (including with children) (n = 224)






When you attend arts and cultural programs, activities, classes or events, how often would you attend with at least one other person (not including kids)? (n = 224)






What are your main motivations for engaging in arts and cultural activities? (n = 224)






Which of the following prevents you from engaging in arts and cultural activities as much as you may like to? (n = 302)






How do you typically find out about arts and cultural activities in Canberra? (n = 302)




How would you prefer to find out about arts and cultural activities (what platforms / which locations)? (n = 302)






Are there any arts and cultural activities that you would like to engage in, but are currently not able to access? (n = 302)

What are the arts and cultural activities that you would like to engage in, but are currently not able to access? (only based on "yes" responses for question 11) (n = 73)








Prior to today, were you aware that Gorman House had been renamed the Gorman Arts Centre? (n = 110)






What do you most associate with the Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres? (n = 110)






In the past 24 months, which of the two Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres have you attended? (n = 110)














What do you think are gaps in Canberra arts and cultural sector that you feel could be addressed by the Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres? (n = 110)
















What arts and cultural activities do you think the Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres deliver? (n = 89)













What is your area of work? (n = 18)






What do you think are currently the most valuable aspects of the Ainslie Arts Centre? (n = 22)

What do you think are currently the most valuable aspects of the Gorman Arts Centre? (n = 21)








What are the top three areas that you think the Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres should prioritise? Please select three. (n = 18)








Which one of the following best describes your main relationship with Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres? (n = 41)






Are you based mainly at Ainslie Arts Centre or Gorman Arts Centre, or do you make equal use of both centres? (n = 41)










Do you run public-facing programs or activities at Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres, or host visitors at the arts centres? (n = 41)






How well would you say the needs of your visitors are currently met by the facilities and services available at the arts centres? (n = 26)






When you think of Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres as places, do you think of them as: (n = 38)












Overall, how well would you say the facilities you use at Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres currently meet your needs? (n = 33)

- Respondents who said they needed more smaller spaces mentioned needing space for individual lessons and meetings.




What could be improved about the outdoor space at Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres? Please select all that apply. (n = 33)






How could we improve the accessibility of Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres? Please select all that apply. (n = 33)






What could Ainslie and Gorman Arts Centres do to better meet your needs and the needs of others in your sector? The higher the score, the more important the item. (n = 33)






How well would you say the following needs are met for you at the arts centres? (n = 33). 5 being the highest and 1 being the lowest.
