Her career highlights include presenting at the UNESCO Culture 2030 summit in China (2019) representing the National Museum of Australia; cofounding, project managing and co-curating the Yiwarra Kuju (One Road) exhibition and The Canning Stock Route Project in partnership with FORM, the National Museum and ten Aboriginal art centres from Western Australia's western desert region. This exhibit continues to tour (in partnership with DFAT) and has been seen by over 1.9 million people globally.

Her achievements include: the 2021 MAGNA Award – Australian Museums and Art Galleries Association's Best Indigenous Project through her management of the National Museum of Australia's Encounters Fellowships Program and Cultural Connections Initiative; as project manager with Thylacine Design winning the 2021 DNA Paris Design Award for Interior Design establishing the permanent galleries of the inaugural Western Australian Museum's Boola Bardip (Many Stories);

and the 2022 Peter Yu Award for the National Museum of Australia's Cultural Connections Initiative Team.

Carly's holds a Postgraduate Diploma in Social Impact, Innovation + Entrepreneurship (FOXTEL Scholarship) from the University of Western Australia (2013), a Postgraduate Diploma in Anthropology, Humanities, from the University of Melbourne (2000) and a Bachelor of Arts - Art History and Curatorship, Anthropology major, from the Australian National University (1995). As a Winston Churchill Trust Fellow (2014), Carly explored First Nations' participatory media toolkits across various international landscapes, solidifying her passion for amplifying diverse voices and cultural governance.
